Minor in Art

A Minor in Art is designed for students seeking an exposure to art as an integral part of their liberal arts degree. The program allows students to explore the practice, history and theory of the studio arts. The Minor in Art is available to all students at Chapman University with departmental approval. Students interested in the Minor in Art should first meet with an official Student Peer Advisor in the studio program to discuss the application process and degree requirements. The application to the Minor in Art should provide a digital application portfolio (PDF files) that includes 5-8 photos of artworks they have completed. The Studio Art Faculty will review applications and notify students when decisions are made. The Minor has enough flexibility to allow students either to experience a wide range of media and disciplines or concentrate their studies in one area.
