SURVEY OF AMERICAN FEARS 2018

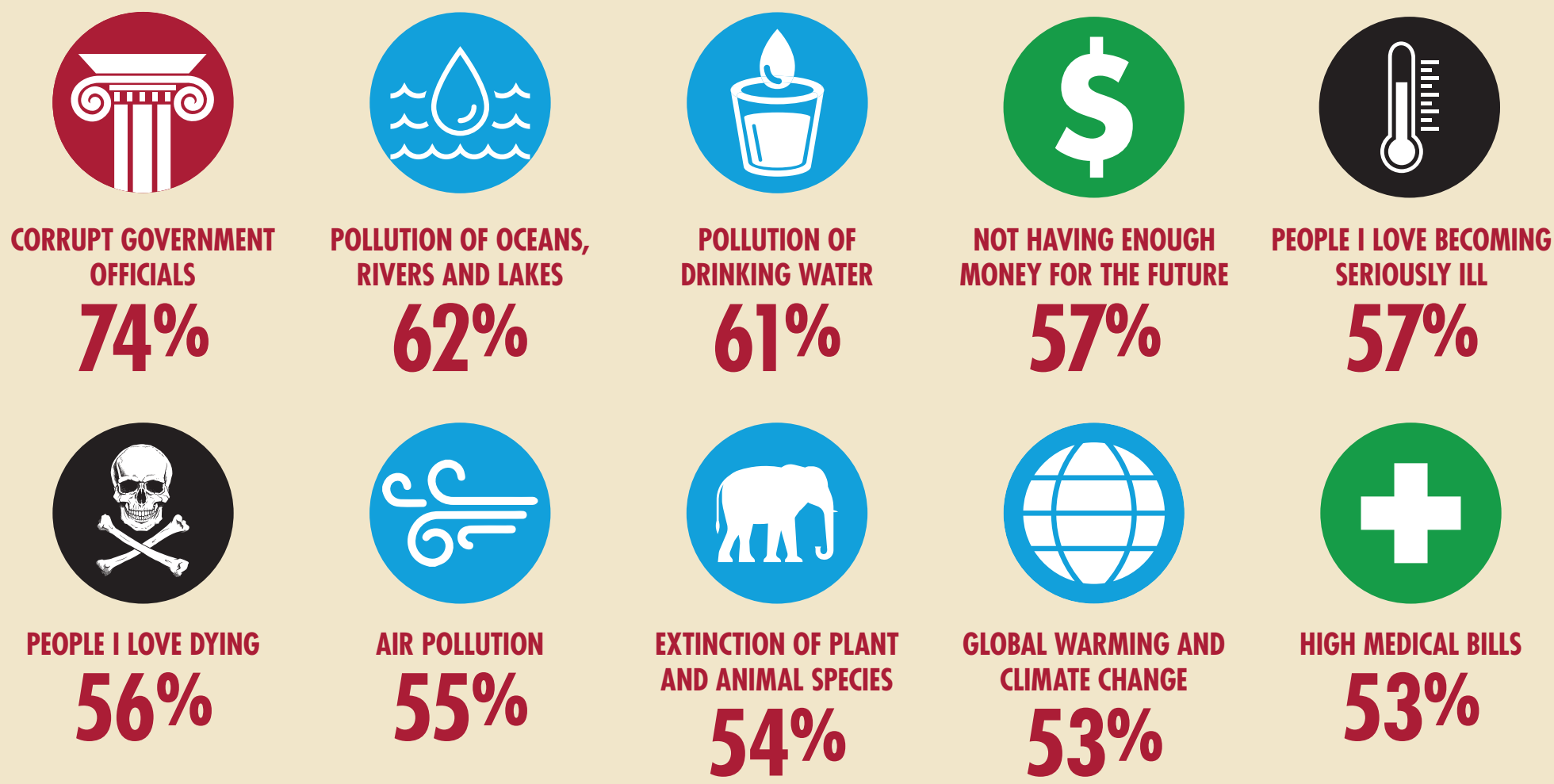

For the first time on our survey (2018) a majority of Americans are afraid of each of the top 10 items.

Five of the top 10 fears are related to the environment.

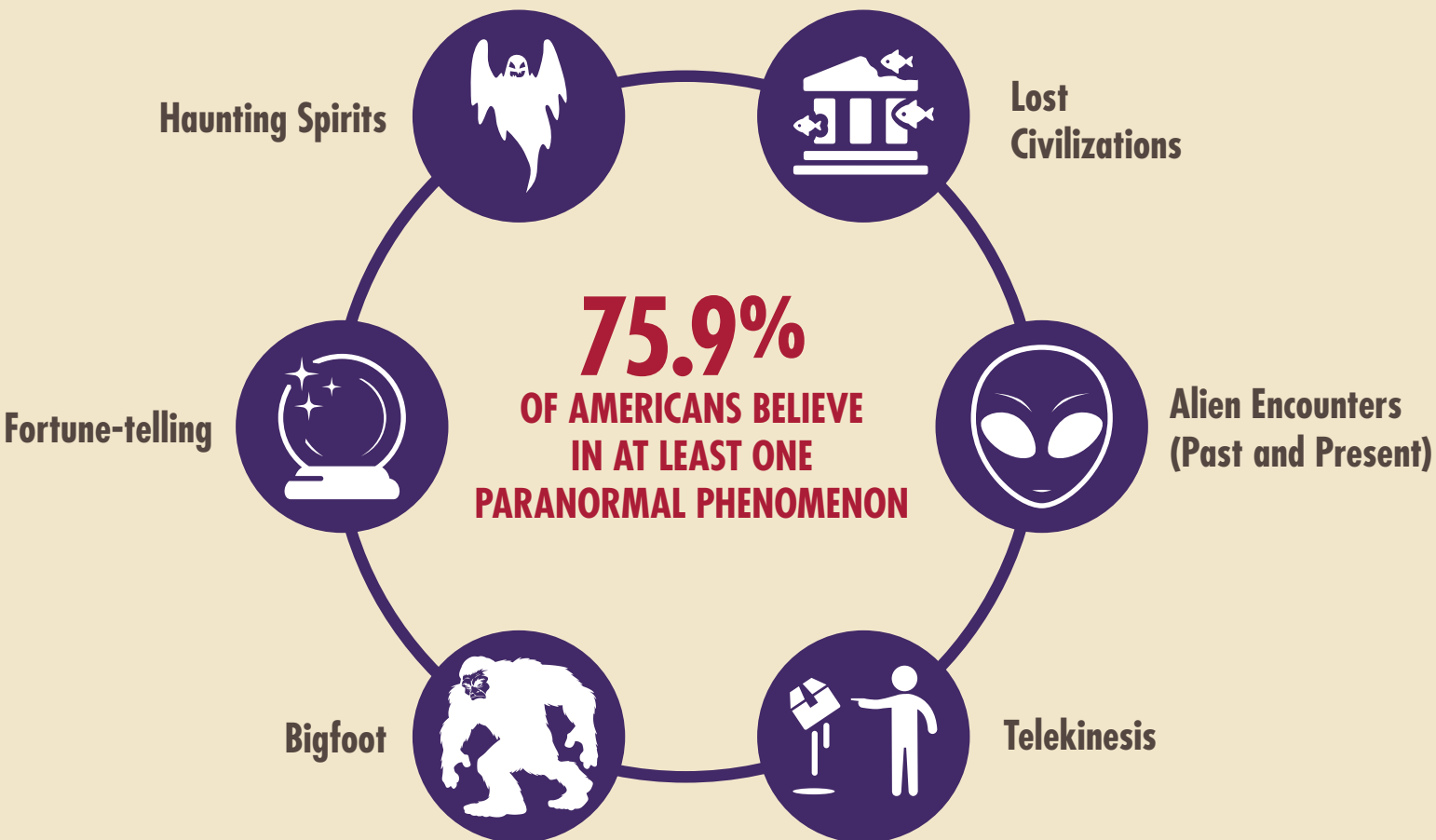
WHY AMERICANS DON'T EVACUATE
